The Department of Pathology at Stanford University School of Medicine seeks two academic Dermatopathologists/Surgical Pathologists at the rank of assistant professor for appointment in the Medical Center Professoriate. The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the MCL shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. Faculty appointed as Assistant Professors in the MCL will have completed their house staff training and, when appropriate, postdoctoral fellowship training. They should have demonstrated during this training period exceptional qualities and promise to become outstanding clinicians and clinical teachers. If these individuals have not had formal teaching experience, they should have demonstrated during their house staff and fellowship training a commitment to develop the skills necessary for outstanding teaching. They must demonstrate excellence or promise of excellence in a combination of clinical performance, clinical teaching and scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine appropriate to the programmatic need upon which the appointment will be based.

Candidates must hold an M.D. or an M.D., Ph.D., be board certified or board eligible in either anatomic pathology and dermatopathology, or in dermatology and dermatopathology and are required to hold or to be eligible for a current license to practice medicine in the State of California. Duties will include extensive sign-out responsibilities in dermatopathology and an important role in Stanford's Dermatopathology Fellowship Program and in the training of residents in anatomic pathology and dermatology. Depending on the interests of the successful candidates, sign-out responsibilities in surgical pathology and/or activities in molecular pathology can also be arranged. A record of independent scholarly contributions in clinical, translational or basic research is required, since the successful candidate will be expected to establish a research program in dermatopathology and/or related fields. There are abundant opportunities for such research, which can include collaborations with colleagues in the Pathology and Dermatology Departments and in other departments at the University. Moreover, the Department of Pathology is committed to providing faculty with clinical responsibilities both time and support to pursue research programs.

Applicants should submit a curriculum vitae, as well as a brief description of research accomplishments and plans for future research. These, with the names of three references, should be sent to:
